

What does a red light on my AT&T router mean?

What are the status lights for 2Wire 2701hg-b?

Status lights for 2Wire 2701HG-B Power is off or gateway is not getting power. Power is on. Power on/self-test failed or gateway has malfunctioned. No cable or device is connected to gateway, or gateway is off. A device is connected by Ethernet to the gateway. Data traffic on the network. No devices are connected wirelessly or gateway is off.

How do I fix a blinking red light on my AT&T router?

You can also go through the AT&T outages page and search for your area via ZIP code or by signing in with your account. If there is a known outage, your only option is to wait. AT&T will fix the issue on its own, and the blinking red light on AT&T router will disappear after that.

Why is my AT&T router blinking red?

A common reason for the blinking red light issue on AT&T routers is broken cables or loose connections—especially if the light is blinking slowly (1-2 blinks/second). Make sure all the cables are firmly inserted in their ports. Similarly, examine your cables for any damage, cuts, and bends, and straighten out any sharp bends you may find.

Why does my AT&T smart home keep blinking red?

To handle overloading, simply change your WiFi password (from the Smart Home Manager app) and connect your devices one by one. If your AT&T device has a battery backup, you will get the blinking red light when the battery runs out of juice. In this case, you need to replace your battery with a new one to resolve the issue.

If any of the lights on your AT&T router are blinking red, it could be due to one of these issues: Internet

outage from AT& T; Problem with the cables; Overloading; Weak battery; ...
