

Can you bring a powerbank on a plane?

Powerbanks are allowed inside the cabin but they're not allowed in checked baggage, so if you're planning to pack some sort of portable charger for your electronic devices, you better bring it on the plane! The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) has some rules and regulations regarding lithium metal and lithium-ion batteries.

According to the FAA, there are no limits to the number of personal power banks you are allowed to bring on your flight. However, any power banks or batteries brought for commerce purposes will be confiscated by airport security. Make sure you bring only your personal power banks.

Do I need to declare a power bank on a plane?

If you're traveling with a power bank that's larger than 27,000 mAh, you will need to declare it because those power banks can only be brought on the plane with airline approval. I haven't declared a smaller power bank at the security checkpoint, but I always take it out for the scanner.

Can I take a solar backpack on a plane?

Solar backpacks that don't store power in a battery and are used to directly charge devices via USB should be allowed on a plane both as check and carry-on luggage. Most solar backpacks fit this description.
