

Can you leave a car in a charging station?

Charging spaces are for charging only, not for parking. You shouldn't leave your car in the charging station after it has fully charged. Make sure you move your car after it has charged fully, so other customers can have access to the charger. Consideration is key when using the charging point. Don't do what you won't like others to do to you.

Should I move my car when fully charged?

Always move your car when fully charged, unless it is directly intended for longer stays - e.g. it is a 7kW charge post at park and ride or similar. At destination chargers (not Rapids) just plug in and leave it whilst you go about your business. Don't "park" in an EV charging spot and not at least plug-in. That's even worse than ICE'ing (IMHO).

Should I leave my eV to charge overnight?

Avoid leaving your EV to charge overnight, if you know you only need a few hours to "fill up." If you must use a public EV charging station overnight, be sure to unplug it first thing in the morning and move your vehicle to allow others to begin their charge. Follow posted time limits to ensure other EV owners have a chance to charge.

Can you leave a charging car unattended?

We will explore if you can leave your car when charging and when fully charged, whether it is okay to unplug another's car and what good charging etiquette entails. You can leave your charging car unattended at a public charging point. Unlike gas cars, you don't have to wait between 30 mins to 1 hour for your car to get full.

Should I move my EV before or after charging?

This allows other EV drivers to charge their cars without unnecessary delays. If you know your EV will finish charging by a specific time, move your car by then or slightly earlier, especially if the EV charger is in high demand during peak times. Should you park in an EV charging spot?

EV owners who don't need to charge their cars should park in standard parking areas. In the same vein, don't park in an EV spot if you have a conventional internal combustion engine (ICE) car.
