

What is Illinois Solar for All?

Illinois Solar for All is a state program that makes solar installations more affordable for income-eligible residents, allowing more people to enjoy savings on their energy bills. Eligible households or organizations can get affordable solar energy for no or low upfront costs.

What are Illinois' new solar incentives?

Illinois homeowners can now access unprecedented renewable energy incentives, marking a transformative shift from previous solar incentives. The federal Investment Tax Credit (ITC) offers a 30% tax reduction on total system costs, while Illinois' Smart Solar program provides upfront rebates covering up to 40% of installation expenses.

What is the Illinois Solar Energy Association?

The Illinois Solar Energy Association (ISEA) is a non-profit organization that promotes the widespread application of solar and other forms of renewable energy through education and advocacy. ISEA is the state resource for renewable energy related policy developments, educational classes, events and access to local renewable energy vendors.

Can I get a solar energy rebate in Illinois?

Manage the flow of electricity from a solar project to the grid. In Illinois, ComEd and Ameren offer the Smart Inverter Rebate to customers for installing solar panels and another rebate for installing an energy storage device. That rebate is not available to customers who do not export power to the grid.
