

Why do solar companies go bankrupt?

Lower sales due to higher solar financing costs are making it harder for installers to stay afloat and resulting in solar company bankruptcies. The solar industry, once dominated by a few key players, has seen a surge in new entrants in recent years, leading to solar company bankruptcies.

Will there be more solar bankruptcies this year?

Analysts are predicting even more solar bankruptcies this year as high interest rates and changing policies about how much people can get compensated for their solar power dampen consumer enthusiasm. What has caused over 100 solar bankruptcies in 2024?

2024 has brought immense challenges, with higher interest rates, tighter financing, and adverse policy shifts in key states contributing to over 100 solar bankruptcies based on our industry data, a number unseen before in our almost 20 years in the solar sector.

Which solar companies filed bankruptcy in 2021?

In late October 2021, several solar companies filed for bankruptcy. On October 14, SunStore Solar, LLC (South Carolina) and UniEnergy Technologies, LLC (Washington State) filed petitions. Let's Go Solar, LLC (Texas) followed on October 15, and Coatesville Solar Initiative, LLC (Pennsylvania) filed on October 20.

Why did SunPower file for bankruptcy?

SunPower filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy on August 5, 2024. The filing came as the company struggled with financial challenges, including competition from international manufacturers, declining margins, and fluctuating solar incentives. Also, it faced scrutiny from U.S. regulators over its accounting practices.

Are solar companies going out of business?

Even some well-established installation companies have struggled financially, leading to solar closures or restructurings. Companies that once seemed secure, like Solcious, Pink Energy, Vision Solar, and Sungevity, are now part of the increasing number of solar company bankruptcies or closures.

SunPower joins Titan Solar Power and Sunworks as publicly-traded residential solar installers that have gone under this year, along with many smaller installers, particularly in California.
