

How do you make a lotion bar?

Make lotion bar sticks stored in deodorant containers that can be rubbed on for easy application. Combine the butters, beeswax pellets, and coconut oil in the top of the double boiler or in a mason jar sitting on a washcloth in a small saucepan. Put about an inch of water in the bottom of the double boiler or in the saucepan and bring to a boil.

How do you make solid lotion bars without beeswax?

Here's the basic recipe for solid lotion bars without beeswax: In a double boiler, melt all the ingredients together except for the essential oil. You can also use a microwave in short bursts, like 30 seconds each time. When it is all melted, take it off of the heat and stir the essential oil into the mixture.
