What is a solo in an opera called?

What do you call a soloist in opera?

An opera soloist is usually referred to according to his or her vocal range, i.e., soprano, mezzo-soprano, tenor, baritone, bass. The leading lady (usually a soprano) may be referred to as the prima donna and the hero (nearly always a tenor) as the primo tenore. Prima Donnas are sometimes referred to as "divas";
